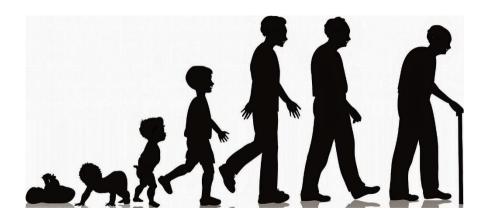
## What should I already know from Years 3 and 4?
