<p>Stone Age</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> They were hunter gathers They travelled around to find food and shelter Made tools out of stone and wood Moved around in small tribes After 790,000 years, started to farm the land and settle in areas with fresh water and good land to farm <p>Bronze Age</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Britain had lots of tin and copper in the ground The Beaker people travelled from Europe to Britain Beaker people settled and taught how to make Bronze from tin and copper Made tool, weapons and wheels out of bronze <p>Iron Age</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Iron was discovered in Britain from the rock Iron Ore Iron was strong and made good weapons and farming equipment Now able to farm more land, create better crops and build large armies with strong weapons 	<p>Stone Age</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Small nomadic groups Travelled around Britain and Europe for the best weather, best food and fresh water to survive <p>Bronze Age</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Beaker people lived in clans led by powerful chiefs.
