People celebrate festivals in different ways. There are religious and non-religious festivals. These festivals have things in common and are worth celebrating. The values of community, commitment and self-sacrifice lie behind the festival of Vaiskhi (Guru's day)– and it's not just Sikhs who uphold these values.	The story of Pesach (Passover) focuses on God's deliverance of the Hebrew people from slavery by God in the book of Exodus. It reveals to Jewish believers about what God is like – e.g. powerful, faithful to his promises.	The words spoken during both religious and non-religious wedding ceremonies show what commitment, love and promises during good times and bad times means.
